- 35 Mixed flowers, 1 vase, excluding shrubs and trees, maximum 12 stems.
- 36 Mixed flowers, 1 vase excluding shrubs and trees, minimum 6 kinds, foliage and/or grasses permitted. To be judged for quality and effect (60:40)
Prize Scale C

- 37 Flowering shrub or tree, 1 vase, 1 cultivar (all same colour).
- 38 Flowering shrubs and/or trees, 1 vase, mixed.
- 39 Ornamental foliage, 1 vase, minimum 5 kinds.
- 40 Flowering pot plant, excluding bulbs, corms and tubers, any size pot.
- 41 Foliage pot plant, any size pot.
- 42 Pot plants in 3 separate pots, 3 different cultivars/species. Individual pots must not exceed 175mm (7") in diameter.
- 43 *Novice* - Pot plant, maximum pot size 225mm (9").
- 44 Cactus or succulent, in bowl/pot, not to exceed 225mm (9") diameter.
- 45 Alpine plant(s), in bowl/pot not to exceed 225mm (9") diameter.

VEGETABLE SECTION

- 46 Rhubarb, 5 sticks.
- 47 Any other vegetable, numbers not less than half that specified in RHS Rules.

DOMESTIC SECTION

- 50 Marmalade, any fruit, 450g/1lb approximately.
- 51 Cheese straws, 6.
- 52 Rhubarb fool, individual portion, with recipe.
- 53 3 hot cross buns.
- 54 Chocolate cake, 175mm/7in tin.
- 55 Simnel Cake.
- 56 Quiche Lorraine, individual portion.
- 57 **Gentlemen only.** Banana bread, 3 slices.

Prize Scale B

125g/4½oz white self-raising flour, 100g/3½oz wholemeal flour, 1 level tsp baking powder, 150g/5½oz demerara sugar, pinch of salt, ½ tsp ground cinnamon, ½ tsp ground nutmeg, 2 large, ripe bananas, 175ml/6fl oz orange juice, 2 eggs, beaten, 4 tbsp rapeseed or olive oil. Preheat the oven to 180°C, gas mark 4; lightly grease and line a 450g/1lb loaf tin. Sift the flours, baking powder, sugar, salt and spices into a large bowl. In a separate bowl, mash the bananas with the orange juice, then stir in the eggs and oil. Pour into the dry ingredients and mix well. Spoon into the prepared tin and bake in the oven for 1 hour, or until a skewer inserted into the loaf comes out clean. Remove from the oven and leave to cool in the tin. Turn out the loaf, slice and serve.

- 64 A hand-sewn item.
- 65 A painting in any medium, mounted or unmounted, framed or unframed. Overall size of exhibit not greater than 36cm x 51cm (14" x20").
- 66 An item of woodwork, decorative or practical.
- 67 Any other kind of handicraft not listed in classes 60-66. Size must not exceed 45cm (18") in length, breadth or height.

PHOTOGRAPHY

Photographs may be digital or film, colour or black & white, mounted or unmounted but the unmounted photograph must not exceed 200mm x 150mm (8"x6") in size.
